Below you will find some general information about our deficit and part of our plan to reduce it. Please note this is an iterative process, so the plan will change as circumstances change. An important element of the plan is the Voluntary Separation Program, which will influence what happens in other areas. This is a plan that will lead to fiscal health for SUNY Potsdam.

1. Annual and Structural Budget Deficit – How We Got Here

Our plan is focused on eliminating a \$9M structural deficit

2. General Overview of Recovery Plan

- Line one (1) includes savings from proposed program discontinuations
- Line two ② includes savings from reduction in force. As a reminder, to ensure the continued viability of our other programs, faculty positions in some areas other than the proposed program discontinuations will be reduced as we adjust our workforce to serve our existing enrollment.
- Line three (3) includes retirements and separation of service, which are voluntary programs
- Line four 4 includes collaboration with SUNY on revenues / expenses to ensure ongoing success for the Crane School of Music
- Line five (5) includes State Operating Aid support. As a result of the 2023/24 state budget, SUNY Potsdam received a \$2.5M increase in Operating Aid, representing a 23% increase in state tax support. Of the \$2.5M, \$1.8M is a sustainable operating aid increase, and \$700K is for investment to support students with disabilities, mental health services, internships, and to address food insecurity.
